General tuition rates

Undergraduates—The following per-credit semester tuition rates have been approved for the 2009-10 academic year. Rates do not vary by college of enrollment and are the same for both upper and lower division students. All degree-seeking undergraduates pay a flat tuition rate based on a minimum 13-credit load (and also pay the student services fee and a full technology fee); credits 1-12 are assessed at the per-credit rate listed below *only* for those students who have been approved for a reduced credit load. Non degree-seeking students are charged per credit for credits 1-12 and a flat tuition rate for 13 or more credits.

Graduate students—The following semester rates have been approved for 2009-10. The plateau for the Graduate School is 6-14 credits. With this plateau there is no charge (except course fees) for the 7th-14th credits. Each credit above 14 is assessed on a per-credit basis.

General fees: apply to most students

University Fee—The University fee helps cover costs in a wide variety of areas related to instruction, student services, and academic support. It is not dedicated to one particular need. This fee is assessed to *all* students and will be prorated as follows: \$60.00 per credit for students taking 1-9 credits; \$600.00 for students taking 10 credits or more. Undergraduates (including reciprocity students) who are classified as full-time by their college are required to pay the full University fee regardless of their credit load. Students must appeal to their college for an exception to full-time classification.

Student services fee—All students enrolled for 6 or more credits must pay a \$348.41-per-semester student services fee in addition to tuition. Courses that carry no degree credit and all courses in which you enroll as an auditor count in the determination of the credit total for the student services fee on a one class hour = one credit basis. Non-degree students and post-secondary students do not need to pay the student services fee. Students in a certificate academic plan or in specialized/evening/part-time academic plans may also be exempt (check with your program office for more information). In addition, credits for off-campus, Learning Abroad Center/Office of International Programs, Online and Distance Learning courses, Minnesota English Center courses, and web-based/TV courses are excluded from the total credit count. Students meeting the above exemption criteria may elect to pay the fee if they wish to use or support the services covered by the fee. Regents' Scholarship recipients, as well as students enrolled in the Senior Citizen Education program, are also exempt from this fee and may not elect to pay the fee. The fee is distributed among various programs. The programs and their amounts are available online at onestop.umn.edu/finances/costs_and_tuition/tuition_and_fees/student_service_fees.html.
